August 9, Thursday: Big Elk Creek to intersection of Siddoway Fork: Trip Coordinator: Sam Pole. Round trip approx. 13 miles.. This is a fairly easy hike over relatively flat terrain following Big Elk Creek. Please call prior to the hike and lets meet at 7:30 a.m. at the Ammon Walmart on the garden end of the store parking area.

August 18, Saturday: Over-night to Darby Canyon/Wind Cave: Trip Coordinator: Sam Pole. Round trip approx. 6 miles. A moderate hike up to a hanging valley containing Wind Cave. Water is present exiting the cave and there is good camping within a short distance. The cave opening is very interesting and there is the possibility of a hike up Fossil Mountain over-looking the Wind Cave valley. Please call in advance and lets meet 7:30 a.m. at the Ammon Walmart on the garden end of the store parking area.

August 25, Saturday: Table Mountain: Trip coordinator: Sam Pole. Round trip approx. 13 miles. This is the classic that must be done at least once every season. The hike begins in Teton Canyon east of Driggs. Please call in advance and lets meet at 6:30 a.m. at the Ammon Walmart on the garden end of the store parking area. We are meeting earlier because of the time it takes to get to the trailhead in Teton Canyon and the climb to the top. Our reward will be spectacular views of the Tetons.

Free Maps:

By the time you are reading this, 10 more of Alan's color topographic maps at a scale of 1:112,500 covering the entire Dubois Ranger District of the Caribou-Targhee National Forest will be available for free download from the National Forest web site: <http://www.fs.fed.us/r4/caribou-targhee/maps/>. These maps complement maps of the Palisades and Teton Ranger District that were posted last year. There are also 5 specialty (more detailed) maps of the Dubois District covering popular trail use areas including: Trail Creek, Stoddard Creek, Eightmile Canyon, Signal Peak and Webber Creek. Hard copies of the specialty maps will be available from the Dubois Ranger District. On this page there is an index map showing an 8 page map that covers the entire ranger district and connecting areas at a scale of 1:112,500. Each map must be downloaded separately and they can be pasted together to form one large map. Hard copies of these maps are not available from the FS. There are also 12 more detailed "Specialty" maps covering specific trails. These maps are at a scale of 1:50,000 with shaded relief and are detailed enough to replace USGS topographic maps in most cases. Coordinates of trailheads and key intersections are provided. Since the files are large, a high speed internet connection is needed.
