IDAHO ALPINE CLUB GENERAL MEETING BRING A FRIEND AND ATTEND "SKI MOUNTAINEERING" WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 4, 2009 ~ 7:30 PM IDAHO FALLS LIBRARY

We are fortunate in having as our speaker this month, photographer Chris Figenshau, who specializes in ski and ski mountaineering photography. Chris' clients include Marmot, Patagonia, North Face and Rossignol. Working in the field 100 days a year, Chris has published photos in Skiing, Powder, Outside, Sports Illustrated and Backcountry magazines. Chris' slide show will first feature skiing, free riding and mountaineering in the Tetons and then he'll take us on a tour around the world with photos of ski descents in Morocco, Bolivia, Alaska, Europe and New Zealand. A few years ago Chris spent a month in Greenland experimenting with wind-driven kite-skiing across the glaciers, drinking imported eight-dollar cans of beer (sparingly) and, most importantly, climbing and skiing as many un-named peaks as time and weather would allow. Later, his photos of this expedition appeared in Skiing magazine. In the warmer months, Chris can be found at ground zero of various wildfires around the country documenting fire fighting efforts with his camera for the National Interagency Fire Center in Boise. Be sure to come and enjoy the exciting slides of this nationally published ski photographer.

The meeting is open to the public and all outdoor enthusiasts are invited to attend.

Additional trips to be added over the winter, depending on conditions. If the roads are closed as many times as they were last year, or the weather too severe, the location of a trip may change or the trip may be canceled altogether.

All Trips Bring Your Own:

1. Water
2. Food/snacks
3. Dress in layers. Bring adequate extra Winter appropriate protective clothing-no cotton. Hat and gloves or mittens.
4. Minor first aid items including sun screen, personal medications, as needed during the day.
5. Headlamp (& Batteries)

6. Map & Compass
7. Sunglasses
8. Lightweight shelter / space blanket.
9. Appropriate equipment-skis or snowshoes, boots, poles, skins, shovel and avalanche transceiver depending on activity or terrain.
10. Repair kit for your own equipment including duct tape and wax kit or glide liquid.
11. Mat to sit on

Other personal items of interest

February 7 Snowshoe Mink Creek:

Join us in exploring Mink Creek with a snowshoe trip on the trails near Pocatello. This is a Park 'n' Ski permit required trailhead. Permits are \$7.50/3 Day or \$25.00/Annual and are available at Idaho Mt. Trading, IDPR East Region HQ, Sportsman's Warehouse, East Idaho Visitors Ctr, Scotts Ski, and the Raven's Nest.

February 21 XC Ski Ricks Basin:

Depending on conditions we will classic or skate ski on the groomed Nordic trails at Grand Targhee Resort. There are 10 miles of groomed trails that range from beginner to advanced. Day passes are \$10 for adults and \$5 for seniors or children.

March 7 XC Ski Ricks Basin:
