"Trekking in Nepal"

Steve Bengston was on a two month trek from Makalu base camp to Everest base camp thirty years ago when, along the way, he paused to stare down into the upper Hongu Valley. The view intrigued Steve and he thought it would be a nice place to come back and visit some time. Thirty years later, this past October and November, Steve finally had a chance to realize his desire to go back and visit the Hongu Valley. Steve, a former member of the IAC, along with two other former members, Bob Hammer and Dean Millsap, and a fourth friend Dave Wright spent 30 days exploring this beautiful area of Nepal. Steve also took time out to do a non-technical ascent of 21,830 foot Mera Peak using crampons and ice ax. Steve and his friends put the trip together themselves, hiring a guide and 8 or 9 porters to carry their gear. Come enjoy Steve's slideshow of this beautiful and remote area of the world. The meeting is open to the public and all outdoor enthusiasts are invited. President Speaks

This is the time of year to get your reservations for backcountry camping sites in the national parks. If you wait till summer you have to show up 48 hours in advance and hope a site is still available. Reservations guarantee you a spot. You just have to pick up your permit on time. This includes climbing and backpacking and kayak/canoe trips. The rules are different for each park.

Grand Teton National Park accepts requests from January 1st -May 15th. Requests for advance reservations may be submitted by mail, fax, online or in person. GTNP's web page <http://www.nps.gov/grte/planyourvisit/back.htm>. There is also a neat link for climbing and backcountry information including current weather forecasts and avalanche conditions or the conditions of trails and climbing routes in the summer months.

Yellowstone National Park starts processing requests for its backcountry permits April 1st. Requests for reservations must be submitted by mail or in person only, not by phone or by fax. Reservation requests submitted before April 1st are processed in random order. Reservations requested after April 1st are processed on a first come, first served basis. Access YNP's web page <http://www.nps.gov/yell/planyourvisit/backcountryhiking.htm> then click on Online Backcountry Trip Planner.

Another option for summer trips that require reservations are trail building projects with the Continental Divide Trail Alliance or the American Hiking Society. The CDTA trips are free for members or \$19 for non-members, but you may be asked to bring your own food. The AHS trips on the other hand provide food but cost \$245 for members or \$275 for non-members. These projects are a great way to improve trails in our backyard and have great fun at the same time.

Now that you are dreaming about all the great trips that you want to do next summer, think about leading a trip for the Idaho Alpine Club. Anyone can lead a trip, just contact the activity coordinator for information. If your not up to leading a trip you can always talk to the activity coordinator and suggest trips you would like to see the club to do. This is an exceptional way to meet new people and see new country.

Getting involved and having fun are what the club is all about. Mark Whitham

March 8 XCSki/Ricks Basin:

Please Note Date Change to Saturday. Depending on conditions we will skate or XC ski on the groomed Nordic trails at Grand Targhee Resort. There are 10 miles of groomed trails that range from beginner to advanced. Day passes are \$10 for adults and \$5 for seniors or children.

March 15 Snowshoe/Teton Park:

Snowshoeing in Teton Park in the winter is an excellent time to see wildlife and/or signs of wildlife in the snow. Join us on a late winter trip in to Phillips Lake or Bradley Taggart or maybe Signal Mt. Area. Park entrance fees or Park pass may be necessary. Plan to eat in Jackson afterwards.

Dubois Grouse Days

April 11-12, 2008

The small, western, high-desert crossroads town of Dubois lies on the Upper Snake River Plain about a dozen miles south of the beautiful Centennial Mountains. Every spring, Greater Sage-Grouse and Columbian Sharp-tailed Grouse congregate on traditional strutting or dancing grounds called leks. These magnificent birds are in need of effective conservation efforts to reverse downward population trends. To experience these birds during their mating rituals is a rare treat that leaves memories that are permanently etched in the mind like fine art. Become one of the fortunate few to experience the magic of grouse during the Annual Dubois Grouse Days Festival! Residents of Dubois, Idaho, and an array of private, state and federal agencies will host the Sixth Annual Dubois Grouse Days to celebrate Greater Sage and Columbian Sharp-tailed Grouse and the wonderful environments that are their home.

Alan brought a GPS to map the 2 ½ miles of trail that the city grooms on the course. He will eventually post the map to the ski club and city recreation department websites. We found a handful of other skiers out enjoying the bracing morning temperatures on the course. Groomed for both skating and classic, Sandcreek is flat and offers a good close by workout for those pressed for time to get a little skiing in. Children's skis and boots are also available to rent. According to the Post Register, Sandcreek's hours of operation are: Thursday, Friday and Sunday from noon to 4:30 p.m. and on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The cost is \$1 per person and kids ski equipment rents for \$5.

On a side note, if you haven't seen Alan's professional looking maps,

check out his maps of eastern Idaho ski venues on the ski club's website. His maps are so good the State of Idaho has asked him to map the trails in the entire state park system. Meanwhile, we heard Kelly Canyon offered cold temps, deep snow, and great skiing for those who did meet at Kelly Canyon. Those of us who went to the Winter Ecology class at Craters of the Moon, enjoyed sun, no wind, and plenty of snow to snowshoe to the tops of Paisley Cone and North Crater.
