IDAHO FALLS LIBRARY

Club members Leland and Lynna Howard will share slides with us from their just published guidebook to Idaho's remote regions called "*Backcountry Roads, Idaho*" at our March meeting. Their new book includes 31 different backcountry road trips from around the state. It took Leland and Lynna two and one half years to research and travel the routes in their book and the end result is a source book of great ideas for summer camping and hiking destinations as the roads they explore are jumping off places for some of Idaho's best scenery. Their book features little known and seldom visited places like Highup and Skytop Lakes in the Beaverheads or Zeno Falls in the Owyhee canyonlands. And if you've ever wanted to check out a great wilderness road like the Magruder Corridor or the Lolo Motorway, the Howards' book gives you the maps, mileages, road ratings, and camping info you need as well as information on the geology and history of an area and what kind of wildlife you may encounter. With an eye for the kind of detailed information an outdoor person can appreciate, if you are in the Upper Pahsimeroi and find that you are in need a cowboy outhouse with a view, the GPS coordinates are there in the book! Lynna is a member of the Great Rift Writers and Women Writing the West and Leland's credits include the National Geographic Society, Audubon, the Sierra Club and Outside magazine. Come and learn about some unfamiliar and beautiful places to visit in our great state and add them to your must do list of places to go this summer.

The meeting is open to the public and all outdoor enthusiasts are invited to attend.

Banff Mountain Film Festival World Tour in Idaho Falls

A trip report from behind the scenes Submitted by Clarke Kido

[So here I am, sitting in a Kelly Canyon evacuation chair, 30 feet above stage, behind the screen. My big fat idea: my stunt, remember that. Rigging looks secure, held by double locking carabineers, 9mm steel cable, pulleys, ropes controlled by stage hands. Red helmet is not comfortable, but provides good visual effect. Pulse is 80, respirations 12, short and rapid. Took a restroom break before climbing onto the chair. Thankful.]

[Ready to begin. Going up. Steady now. Banff film clip takes 5 minutes. I've seen it a dozen times. Don't fuss with the curtains. Don't twist in the chair. Stay alert.]

The Banff film shows a skier setting off an avalanche. The audience is thrilled, shouts, clapping, oohs and aahs. This crowd sounds younger. More families tonight. The film shows an eagle landing on a woman's arm. The announcer guy does a voice over by saying "this program is brought to you by National Geographic and New Balance." Something curious. From where I'm watching, above and behind the screen, the NG logo is still recognizable. In fact, the logo doesn't change, whether I view it from the front or back, right side up or upside down.

[The film clip is over, then darkness. The guys are pulling the movie screen up - good job. The crowd is quiet, wondering.]

[Spotlight. It's Showtime! Shout out loud. "BELAY ON?" "ON BELAY!" "BRING ME DOWN." Turn on flashlight. Shine it from side to side. Aim at the balcony. Pause halfway. Wave to the audience. 10 feet to go. Now 5. I'm down, safely. "BELAY OFF?" "OFF BELAY!" "SLACK!"]

[Unbuckle harness. Remove helmet. Walk forward to stage. Screen descends behind me. Put on patrol hat. Scan my notes. Deep breath, then begin. "Good evening and welcome..." Refer to the program with

films, intermission, concessions, displays, prize drawing, claim prizes at end of show. Thank local supporters and audience.]

[Nearly done. "...Our visitor lives in Toronto, but was raised in Skaneateles, NY near Syracuse." Remember to pronounce it as skinny - atlas. Look to stage right, where Liz gives her OK. "Will everyone please join me with a warm Idaho Falls welcome for tonight's host, Elizabeth Nutting." Handshake. Give her the mic. Walk off stage. Relax and enjoy the show.]

All Trips Bring Your Own:

1. Water
2. Food/snacks
3. Dress in layers. Bring adequate extra Winter appropriate protective clothing-no cotton. Hat and gloves or mittens.
4. Minor first aid items including sun screen, personal medications, as needed during the day.
5. Headlamp (& Batteries)
6. Map & Compass
7. Sunglasses
8. Lightweight shelter / space blanket.
9. Appropriate equipment-skis or snowshoes, boots, poles, skins, shovel and avalanche transceiver depending on activity or terrain.
10. Repair kit for your own equipment including duct tape and wax kit or glide liquid.
11. Mat to sit on

Other personal items of interest

March 7 XC Ski Ricks Basin:

Depending on conditions we will classic or skate ski on the groomed Nordic trails at Grand Targhee Resort. There are 10 miles of groomed trails that range from beginner to advanced. Day passes are \$10 for adults and \$5 for seniors or children.

March 21 Snowshoe Teton Park:

Snowshoeing in Teton Park in the winter is an excellent time to see wildlife and/or signs of wildlife in the snow. Join us on a late winter trip in to Phillips Lake or Bradley Taggart Lakes. Park entrance fees or Park pass will be necessary.

March 23-31 - The Withams will be hiking on the Appalachian Trail and to Argow Cabin with some former members in Virginia. Argow Cabin was built around 1850. The cabin is located on the west side of the Blue Ridge, adjacent to the Southern District of Shenendoah National Park. Renovations to the cabin by the Potomac Appalachian Trail Club began around 2003 and continue on a monthly basis.
