IDAHO ALPINE CLUB BYLAWS ARTICLE IX - Common Adventures (Club Trips)

Each common adventure shall be under the jurisdiction of the designated adventure coordinator. The appropriate activity coordinator shall approve the adventure coordinator. The adventure coordinator may refuse participation in a given trip to anyone.

The adventure coordinator should attempt to ensure that a person with recognized first aid or emergency care training participates in the trip.

Non-members may attend a maximum of two club adventures, except rafting which requires membership to participate, or unless otherwise specified by the appropriate adventure coordinator. Participants on an adventure must pay the established adventure fee, abide by club rules and activity

guidelines, and follow instructions of the activity coordinator.

An individual may not participate in any common adventure of the club unless that individual has read and signed the common adventure form for that specific activity prior to embarking on that adventure.

Carry or Bring Your Own:

1. Water
2. Food/snacks
3. Dress in layers. Bring adequate extra Winter appropriate protective clothing-no cotton. Hat and gloves or mittens.
4. Minor first aid items including sun screen, personal medications, as needed during the day.
5. Headlamp (& Batteries)

6. Map & Compass
 7. Sunglasses
 8. Lightweight shelter / space blanket.
 9. Appropriate equipment-skis or snowshoes, boots, poles, skins, shovel and avalanche transceiver depending on activity or terrain.
 - 10 Repair kit for your own equipment including duct tape and wax kit or glide liquid.
 - 11 Mat to sit on
- Other personal items of interest.

Big Holes Mtn. Bike Trail Maps

New US Forest Service maps of the Palisades and Teton Basin Ranger Districts have been posted on the Caribou-Targhee National Forest website. To see them go to:

<http://www.fs.fed.us/r4/caribou-targhee/caribou-targhee/palisades/maps.shtml> for the map index) reflecting the new summer travel plan for the Big Holes and some trail number changes elsewhere.

These changes are reflected a set of 10 maps covering all of the Palisades and Teton Basin Ranger Districts at a scale of 1:112,500. Twelve "specialty" trail maps have also been revised. These are hiking scale maps, 1:50,000 scale, covering popular hiking, ATV and motorcycle trail areas. One entirely new map shows the newly designated and constructed mtn biking trails in the Horseshoe Canyon area west of Driggs. These color maps are free for download and the only current maps available to the public. The trail designations are now legally enforceable.
