IDAHO ALPINE CLUB GENERAL MEETING

"Owyhee Canyonlands"

Wednesday, September 3, 2008, 7:30 PM

IDAHO FALLS LIBRARY

Senator Mike Crapo has introduced a bill in the Senate (S. 2833) to protect the vast sagebrush steppe and canyonlands in southwest Idaho known as the Owyhee Canyonlands. Layne Bangerter, the senator's State Director for Natural Resources and Environment, will speak to us about the pristine lands and rivers of this unspoiled ecosystem. He'll describe how county officials, ranchers, hunters, conservationists and motorized recreational users recognized the importance of protecting this desert resource and came together and addressed each other's concerns and hammered out an agreement to protect 517,000 acres of wilderness and 315 miles of wild and scenic rivers. This summer the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources reported out the Owyhee Public Lands Management Act of 2008, the bill Senator Crapo drafted to codify the provisions the Owyhee stakeholders agreed upon, and the Senate will vote on the bill later this fall. Be sure to come and learn about the efforts to protect this beautiful part of our state. The meeting is open to the public and all outdoor enthusiasts are invited. Day Hiking / Backpacking

Sam will be out of town most of the month of September. October hikes will be posted in the October bulletin. Contact Sam Pole: Home-523-4970, cell-520-3630, or email sbpole@cableone.net for trip information and to sign up to go on a scheduled trip.

NOTE: The following meeting and time information applies to trips led by Sam Pole. If anyone else is leading a trip call them for the meeting location, time, and to sign up to go.

Trip Meeting Places: Unless otherwise noted will leave from two locations:

1. Trips west of the Snake River at Idaho Falls will leave from the West-side Walmart (parking lot at the garden side).

2. Trips basically east of the Snake River at Idaho Falls will leave from the East-side Walmart on Hitt Road (north end or McDonald's end of parking lot).

Trip departures will be at 7:30 a.m. from the parking lots, unless otherwise noted.

If running late, please call or at least always check the parking lot first because others may have called to say they also will be late. If it is more convenient for you to meet us on the way or at the trailhead, please call to let me know. For instance, if someone lives in Rexburg and we are headed past Rexburg to go hiking, we can always meet-up there and proceed.

Hike Minimums:

1. Water
2. Food/snacks
3. Protective clothing-no cotton
4. Minor first aide items
5. Appropriate shoes
6. Personal medications, as needed during the day.

Suggested Other Items:

1. Sun glasses
2. Sun screen
3. Hat
4. Light gloves
5. Hiking staff or poles
6. Other personal items of interest depending on whether one is a minimalist or tech-head.

September 7: Dayhike / Trail Maintenance / South Darby Canyon Wind Cave Trail - Trip Coordinator: Whithams. Round trip is 6.8 miles with a 2000 foot elevation gain. The hike is fairly moderate. The trail is located on the west slope of the Tetons.

We will be performing maintenance on the trail. Wear boots, bring work gloves and loping shears and a small saw if you have one, lunch, water, and the 10 "E's". We have an extra pulaski available. A short section of the trail really needs to be grubbed out to bring it back to spec and several short cuts on the switchbacks need to be brushed out again.

There has been a grizzly lurking on the trail part of the summer. Anyone going will need to carry bear spray, keep their packs in sight, and leash their dogs if they bring them.

Big Holes Mtn. Bike Trail Maps

New US Forest Service maps of the Palisades and Teton Basin Ranger Districts have been posted on the Caribou-Targhee National Forest website. To see them go to:

<http://www.fs.fed.us/r4/caribou-targhee/caribou-targhee/palisades/maps.shtml> for the map index) reflecting the new summer travel plan for the Big Holes and some trail number changes elsewhere.

The changes to the Big Holes include: cross country travel by bicycle is now prohibited; riding is only allowed on FS designated trails and roads. Also, previously ATV travel was allowed on all trails designated motorized but now ATVs are restricted to trails designed for ATVs. Many trails previously open to ATVs are now delimited to motorcycle travel. Some trails are being closed and others are now hiking/equestrian/ biking trails that were previously motorized. Some new trails will be build. These changes are reflected a set of 10 maps covering all of the Palisades and Teton Basin Ranger Districts at a scale of 1:112,500. Twelve "specialty" trail maps have also been revised. These are hiking scale maps, 1:50,000 scale, covering popular hiking, ATV and motorcycle trail areas. One entirely new map shows the newly designated and constructed mtn biking trails in the Horseshoe Canyon area west of Driggs. These color maps are free for download and the only current maps available to the public. The trail designations are now legally enforceable.
